Prairie State Legal Services

Joliet Township is proud to support The Prairie State Legal Services-Senior Legal Assistance Program. This program offers free legal services for persons age 60 and over who have serious civil legal problems and need help to solve them.

Legal issues which the program may be able to assist you with include health care and insurance such as Medicare, Medicaid, and Social Security; elder abuse and financial exploitation; housing issues; nursing home issues and legal assistance to preserve the personal autonomy of seniors.

Project attorneys assist seniors in preparing Powers of Attorney or Living Wills and counsel couples when one spouse requires nursing home or home health care. A range of other services are offered.

To apply, please call the Joliet office at 815-727-5123. Your application will be taken over the phone, which will require basic information about you and your legal problem.
