New Violence Prevention Initiatives

Building a safer tomorrow



In a proactive move to address the impact of gun violence and promote community safety, the Joliet Township Government is proud to announce the launch of Violence Prevention Programming. The township was awarded a total of \$2.3 million in state grants to fund these initiatives, which aim to provide short-term trauma-based intervention along with comprehensive violence prevention measures to address the pressing needs of the Joliet community.

Program Overview: Peace Over Violence (POV)

The cornerstone of this new initiative is the Peace Over Violence (POV) program. Developed by the Joliet Township Government, POV focuses on fostering a safer and healthier community through a multifaceted approach. The program includes case management, street outreach, and victim advocacy, all geared towards reducing incidents of gun violence.

Operating out of the Joliet Township Ozzie and Peggy Mitchell Center, formerly known as Peter Claver, POV extends its services from 9 am to 6 pm Monday through Friday, with Saturday hours from 12 pm to 8 pm. Appointments outside regular hours are available upon request. The center is conveniently located at 172 S. Chicago, Joliet, Illinois 60432. Community Collaboration: Racial Equity Impact Assessment League (REIAL)

To ensure a holistic and community-driven approach, Joliet Township has established the Racial Equity Impact Assessment League (REIAL). Comprising esteemed community leaders, the league meets monthly to discuss firearm violence prevention, coordinate emergency community engagement efforts, and assess the implementation of violence prevention programs. This collaborative effort includes representatives from various sectors, such as education, law enforcement, community engagement, and religious organizations. Trauma Informed Behavioral Health Program (TIBH): A Focus on Healing

As part of the Illinois Department of Human Services Greater Illinois Reimagine Violence Prevention grants, Joliet Township is thrilled to introduce the Trauma Informed Behavioral Health Program (TIBH). This program, staffed by three licensed trauma therapists, will provide mental health services to residents affected by trauma, with a particular focus on those impacted by gun violence. The TIBH team will offer education on recognizing and responding to signs of trauma, behavioral health therapy, and resource coordination.

By actively addressing the root causes of violence and trauma, Joliet Township is taking strides towards creating a safer and more resilient community for all its residents.

First Year For Summer Internship Program

Nurturing future leaders and community leaders



Joliet Township Government proudly launched its inaugural summer internship program this year, welcoming 12 enthusiastic students into a hands-on learning experience. This innovative program not only offers valuable opportunities for high school and college students to apply their knowledge in real-world scenarios but also serves as a platform to expand the township's community outreach to its over 86,000 residents.

Empowering Through Experience

The summer internship program at Joliet Township is designed to provide students with a paid opportunity to immerse themselves in an area of interest. Interns actively contribute to the daily operations of both the administrative and animal control buildings, as well as collaborate with external community partners. Interns also took to the streets, canvassing neighborhoods to raise awareness about township services, creating engaging social media content, and actively participating in data collection for public health services. This direct engagement with residents allowed interns to bridge the gap between the township and its community, fostering a deeper understanding of the diverse needs and concerns of the residents.

Collaboration with community leaders

This summer, interns were engaged in impactful projects at partnering agencies, playing a pivotal role in supporting and facilitating on-site registration for the Solstice Solar Energy Program. Working closely with esteemed community organizations such as African American Business Association, The Spanish Community Center, Forest Park Community Center, Holsten Human Capital Development, National Hook-up for Black Women, and the YMCA, interns experienced firsthand the impact of community-driven initiatives.

Positive Impact and Encouragement

Samantha Martinez, representing LEDA, a nonprofit organization that hosted two of Joliet Township's interns, expressed her hopes for the continuation of the internship program. She remarked, "I sincerely hope that the Joliet Township Government continues with their internship program. Providing students with opportunities to connect with their community and explore various organizations equips them with the tools to go out there and make a change."

The success of this pilot program not only reflects the commitment of Joliet Township Government to fostering the next generation of leaders but also highlights the potential for ongoing positive impact on the community. As these interns carry their experiences forward, they are not only equipped with newfound skills but also inspired to make a lasting difference in the community they call home.

General Assistance: For Residents In Need Qualifying families may receive help with utilities & more



In a commitment to community welfare, Joliet Township offers vital assistance programs, ensuring that residents facing financial challenges can meet their basic needs. The General Assistance (GA) program provides monthly financial aid to those with insufficient income or resources.

General Assistance Services: A Lifeline for Basic Needs

The GA program extends support in various forms, covering essential areas like rent, mortgage, utilities, and car repairs. Services include access to the Medical Loan Closet, Notary Services, and temporary Handicap Placards. Workfare Services are also available.

LIHEAP: Easing the Burden of Utility Bills

In partnership with Will County Center for Community Concerns, the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) initiative seeks to help eligible low-income households manage winter heating expenses. To apply for LIHEAP assistance, visit the Joliet Township Government Office on Wednesday, December 20, 2023, or January 17, 2024.

To streamline the application process, ensure you have the following documents on hand:

- 1. Identification
- 2. Social Security Card/ITINS for all household members
- 3. Current electric and gas bills (both required)
- 4. Proof of gross income for the past 30 days for all household members
- 5. Pay stubs for current unemployment
- 6. IDES Unemployment Letter/UI Findings
- 7. Social Security Benefits Verification Letter
- 8. Letter of DHS Benefits

Additional documents may be requested during the application, and for furnace assistance, proof of homeownership, property tax statement, mortgage statement, or deed is also required.

Free Tax Assistance To Low-Income Families Third season for VITA program, January through April



VITA sites offer free tax help to people who need assistance in preparing their own tax returns

Including:

- People who make \$60,000 or less
- Persons with disabilities
- Limited English-speaking taxpayers

Tax season is just around the corner, and assistance is at hand. In partnership with the IRS and WIII County Center for Community Concerns, Joliet Township offers the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program, aimed at providing valuable tax support to those in need.

Patricia Venziano, a key figure in the program, expresses her passion for VITA, highlighting its significance in providing a much-needed free service to the community in a world where free services are increasingly rare.

Since its inception at Joliet Township in 2021, the VITA program is now entering its third season, aiming to alleviate the financial burden on low-income families. The program addresses the issue of overpayment for tax preparations and loans, with a staggering \$566 million left unclaimed each year by individuals who turn to commercial tax services.

In contrast, VITA meticulously examines available credits to ensure that individuals receive the full benefits they are entitled to. All returns are filed electronically, earning them a preferred status with the IRS. This means that VITA returns are processed ahead of commercial returns, ensuring a faster refund for those in need.


In the 2023 tax season alone, the program assisted in the preparation of 397 tax returns, following the success of supporting 321 returns in 2022. Operating five days a week, the program offers flexibility, allowing individuals to make appointments, pick up tax packets, or receive them by mail.

As Patricia Venziano aptly puts it, "It's a good free tax service, and we're fast. We work on them as they come in the door." The VITA program exemplifies the power of community-driven initiatives, demonstrating that a dedicated group of individuals can make a tangible difference in the lives of those they serve during tax season and beyond.



Assessor's Office News

Potential savings for homeowners in the community



If you're 65+, own your home, and receive the General Homestead Exemption, qualify for an extra \$8,000 off your Assessment with the Senior Citizens Homestead Exemption, plus explore the Senior Freeze Homestead Exemption.

Good News! The recently created Public Act 102-895 makes changes to a couple Homestead Exemption amounts for Joliet Township Residents.

The General Homestead Exemption will increase from \$6,000 to \$8,000. Additionally, the Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption will increase from \$5,000 to \$8,000. Both increases will be for the 2023 Assessment year payable in 2024.

If you are 65 years of age or older and own your home and are receiving the General Homestead Exemption, you can qualify for the Senior Citizens Homestead Exemption worth an additional \$8,000 off your Assessment. There is also a Senior Freeze Homestead Exemption you may be entitled to.

The requirements for the Senior Freeze are as follows:

- Fulfill property residency requirement
- Maximum combined household income must be \$65,000 or less
- Complete and return the Senior Freeze application each year to either the Supervisor of Assessments Office (302 N Chicago St/2nd Floor) OR your Township Assessor's Office (175 W Jefferson St)
- Please remember that this exemption must be renewed and qualified for every year. Once you qualify, you will be mailed the Application each Spring to renew.
- Please note that this exemption freezes your assessment and does NOT freeze your taxes

If you think you may be entitled to the Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption, the Senior Freeze Exemption, or want to make sure you are receiving the exemptions you are entitled to, please give us a call (815) 726-5446 and we will be happy to assist you.

Joliet Township 2023 Bids

In 2023, the Clerk's office oversaw the bidding process for three essential road improvement projects covering a total of 4.29 miles. These improvements aim to enhance the safety and quality of our roadways, ensuring smoother commutes for all residents. As we continue to invest in our community's infrastructure, these improvements contribute to the overall well-being of our township.

Beyond road improvements, the Clerk's office also managed a bid for the remodel of our Animal Control facility. This initiative seeks to create a more accommodating and efficient space for the welfare of our furry friends. We are dedicated to providing the best possible environment for the animals in our care, and this remodel is a step towards achieving that goal.

Joliet Township Municipal Vehicle Program Expected to launch early 2024

Joliet Township is excited to announce the launch of its Municipal Vehicle Program in partnership with PACE. The provision of transportation services to seniors and the youth population is a crucial undertaking in guaranteeing their access to vital appointments and after-school programs. This initiative goes a long way in ensuring that residents can attend critical medical consultations, as well as partake in academic and social activities.

The transit services will be offered within the Joliet Township boundaries extending from the NW quadrant at Theodore and Gaylord to the NE quadrant at Rosalind and Farrell Rd, to the SE quadrant at Cherry Hill and Schweizer Rd, and the SW quadrant at Laraway Road and Centerpoint Way of Joliet Illinois. Medical-only transportation outside of the established boundaries will be limited to an additional ten miles. Joliet Township aims to improve access, affordability, and user satisfaction of rides while increasing ADA-compliant transportation options.

Five passenger community vans will operate weekly for specific-use transportation as needed and scheduled through a paratransit model. The scheduling of trips will be done through the partner agency or through our website. Trips will cost \$2 for general residents and \$1 for senior and disabled residents.

Currently, the Municipal Vehicle Program is in the process of hiring its staff and is expected to launch in January 2024. As a government agency, Joliet Township wants to ensure that reliable transportation services are available to all populations, particularly those with disabilities, to ensure that they have easy access to essential services.
